

Sagitawa Trail Ride Dress Code

We desire for staff and campers to have the best possible experience while at camp. We recognize the popularity of certain styles of clothing and the differing opinions as to what constitutes proper dress. Due to the ruggedness of the camp setting, to ensure the safety of staff and campers, and to assure that no one will feel offended or uncomfortable during his or her stay, the following dress code has been adopted.

If you choose to dress inappropriately, you will be asked to change, or be required to wear a camp shirt. By planning ahead and packing appropriately, you will save yourself the inconvenience of having to change and you would be contributing to a safe, pleasant camp atmosphere.

Please be advised that the following dress code will be enforced for all individuals attending camp, including staff.

1. All clothing shall be neat and acceptable in repair and appearance and shall be worn within the bounds of decency and good taste.
2. Articles of clothing which display profanity, products or slogans which promote tobacco, alcohol, drugs, sex or are in any other way distracting, are prohibited.
3. Excessive accessories such as hanging chains and hanging suspenders are not allowed.
4. Excessively baggy or tight clothing are prohibited.
5. Items of clothing which expose bare midribs, bare chests, undergarments, or that are transparent (see-through) are prohibited. Tank tops with straps wider than one inch are permitted. Please be advised that spaghetti straps, shirts which expose a bare back, halter tops and tube tops are prohibited.
6. Swimming
 - a. Swimsuits for boys/men: Swim trunks only. No Speedos.
 - b. Swimsuits for girls/women: One-piece suits are recommended; however two-piece suits are allowed as long as they are modestly cut. No string, thong or crochet suits will be allowed.
